Course Description

In this class we will begin to explore the elements of theater, theater industry terminology, the fundamentals of acting technique, script analysis, and characterization. Through various exercises students will learn to connect with their fellow actors through improvisation, storytelling, and practical application of some of the most renowned acting methods of the modern era. This class is designed to instill confidence and provide beginning actors with tools needed to successfully progress to Acting 2. Individual and small group work will be the focus, along with beginning movement and vocal technique to properly support the performers voice and physique needed to portray a character to the best of their ability. There will also be an introduction to the essentials of the theater business, unarmed stage combat and intimacy coordination (see QR Code for more on these topics).
